## Re: NACI Statement (May 3, 2024) – Guidance on the use of COVID-19 vaccines during the fall of 2024

Dr. Harrison,

On behalf of <u>The Canadian Immunocompromised Advocacy Network</u> (CIAN), I am writing to express gratitude for the recent NACI guidance, regarding the use of COVID-19 vaccines for the fall of 2024. Our network represents a diverse group of immunocompromised patient groups and advocates, who are at an increased risk for severe health outcomes due to infectious diseases. CIAN is dedicated to raising awareness and advocating for the well-being of immunocompromised Canadians, and we appreciate NACI's statement acknowledging the importance of protecting vulnerable populations from COVID-19.

We are appreciative that the guidance includes access to both mRNA and protein subunit COVID-19 vaccines for those who have not mounted a strong response to the mRNA formulated vaccines. This guidance will make it possible for immune compromised people to be safer, participate in low risk activities, and avoid being isolated in their homes. Topics like this as well as the importance of both active immunization and passive immunization (e.g., monoclonal antibodies, immunoglobulins, etc.) have been areas that CIAN believes are critical in protecting immunocompromised individuals.
