Key Responsibilities

- **Medical and Clinical Research Advisory:** Offer expert guidance on healthcare trends relevant to immunocompromised individuals, helping ensure our messaging, resources, and advocacy efforts are medically accurate and aligned with current standards.
- Research and Strategic Insight: Identify research priorities and data gaps, support communityfocused studies and grant applications, and explore opportunities to serve as a Principal Investigator on CIAN projects with support from the Praxus Health research team.
- **Thought Leadership:** Act as a trusted clinical voice in strategic discussions and public forums to highlight the medical realities and needs of immunocompromised populations.
- Stakeholder Engagement & Networking: Help foster relationships with healthcare professionals, researchers, and decision-makers to strengthen the network of support around CIAN.
- Advocacy Support & Representation: Provide medical expertise to strengthen public communications and help represent CIAN in conferences.
- **Collaboration:** Work alongside CIAN's network, including people with lived experience, to cocreate impactful projects and initiatives.

- Activities may include attending virtual meetings, reviewing or advising health content, and contributing to strategic or research projects
